





MISSILE MAN OF INDIA

**“You have to dream
before your dreams
can come true.”**

– Abdul Kalam

He was someone who didn't live by the ideals of society. He made his own ideals and set his own goals. He knew the path to success and took it without any indifference. He accomplished more than anybody thought was possible and single handedly led India closer to development. He is like a father to all of us.

He is Abdul Kalam. The Missile Man of India.



Family, Early Life and Education

Coming from a poor background, Abdul Kalam was born in Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu. He sold newspapers in his childhood to supplement his family's income. His family couldn't support all of his ambitions but he succeeded




in attaining a degree at St. Joseph's college. Dissatisfied with his qualification, he worked hard and went on to study aerospace engineering at the Madras Institute of Technology.

Life as Scientist

After graduating from MIT, Kalam took up the position of Chief Scientist at the Aeronautical Development Establishment of Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO).

However, the profile didn't appeal and he soon shifted to the Indian Space





Research Organization (ISRO) where he was the Project Director of India's first indigenous Satellite Launch Vehicle. India owes its development as a nuclear nation to Kalam's organizational and technical support for Pokhran-II, nuclear tests in 1998, the first such tests after a gap of 24 years

His years at the ISRO were its most memorable and important ones, as they left a lasting impact on the organization. Kalam led many projects which turned out to be successful each time.



Presidency

In 2002, Kalam received a call from Chandrababu Naidu, the Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh who informed him of another call he would be receiving from Atal Bihari Vajpayee, the then Prime Minister of India. Abdul Kalam was pleasantly surprised and obliged. Upon receiving the call from the Prime Minister, he found out that the other cabinet ministers had considered him a worthy candidate for the role of President. Abdul Kalam was shocked and after consulting his family and friends, he decided to take up the mantle of office.

The media was abuzz minutes after his decision. Thus, Abdul Kalam became


the President of India on 25th July 2002. His sole reason for agreeing to become the President was his ambition to put his India 2020 plan into action and see our country develop into a nation that far surpasses the rest.



Accomplishments and Awards

His efforts earned him the Bharat Ratna, Padma Bhushan and the Padma Vibhushan, the three most notable awards in India. He was awarded honorary doctorates from forty esteemed universities across the world for his excellent work in various scientific fields.

Books and Documentaries



He has written 29 books, the most notable ones being Ignited Minds, Wings of Fire, Turning Points, Indomitable Spirit and India 2020.

"A Little Dream", is a sixty minute documentary film in English capturing the journey of former President Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam's life from Rameshwaram to Rashtrapathi Bhavan. Importance of Education is the theme of the film, which also contains audio and video clips of important people associated with Kalam. The notable dancers and actress, Shobhana has played the lead role in the film.

But what makes Abdul Kalam the unique person he is?

All his accomplishments are barely noticeable compared to his humbleness. When he became the President, Abdul Kalam had all the luxurious rooms of Rashtrapathi Bhavan locked. He moved into a simple room with a single bed where he worked and slept. Kalam also locked the lavish dining room and often sat on the floor to eat with the workers at Rashtrapathi Bhavan. Once, one of his subordinates had promised his children a trip to the fair but hadn't been able to make it because of his hectic workload. But when he returned home, he found out that Kalam had taken his children to the fair instead.

This edition of the Hillside News is thus, based on His Excellency. He was a quintessential Gandhi in a Scientist's robe and the greatest President we have ever had. He built bridges with the people; working for his country's scientific and overall development and helped people follow their dreams.

It's interesting to know that everyone in India knew who the President was during Kalam's tenure. Kalam was easily recognizable with his genial smile and trademark hairstyle. Kalam had earned the title of "The People's President" for taking his role as a President beyond its constitutional definition; always making it a point to put nation first before politics.

Dr. A.P.J Abdul Kalam's visit to our school

Dr. A.P.J Abdul Kalam visited Jubilee Hills Public School in 2005 and left his footsteps for our students to follow. His visit was met with great enthusiasm and



vigour by all the students. His speech was inspiring and thought provoking. A thousand tiny hands rose to say 'yes' to the question whether they can make a corruption-free India or not, asked by the President, Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam. Impressed by their spontaneous response, Dr. Kalam said they could make a big brigade to fight corruption when they grew up.

Interacting with students belonging to different schools he took an oath from the students. In one voice, the students repeated the oath: "I will not support any religious, caste or language differentiation. I will be honest and will

endeavour to make a corruption-free society."

He then asked the students to have a clear vision of their own future. "What I will be remembered for," should be the touchstone of that vision. "Vision is the life of the nation," he said, giving the examples of late Vikram Sarabhai, C.V. Raman, Subramanyam Chandrasekhar and Homi Bhaba. India has become a leader in space research thanks to Dr. Sarabhai's vision, the President quoted.

While answering a question on how to face failure, he said that one should not allow the problem to become the master. "When you encounter a

problem, don't allow it to be your master. You should become the master of the problem," he said.

How Abdul Kalam inspired the youth

Children were very dear to his heart. In fact, Dr. Kalam spent his 80th birthday in a remote village with children and farmers. He visited numerous schools, our school being one of them which he visited in 2005. It is thus, no surprise that in the years 2003 and 2006, he was chosen as a candidate for the MTV Youth Icon Award.

I've never given much thought to who my idol is. But when I was working for this year's issue of Hillside News, I realized immediately, it was Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam. Why? Well, my reasons are simple. I don't consider him my idol just because he is an accomplished aerospace scientist or the former President of India. I idolize him because he is unlike anybody I know. He is a humble man with a mind of his own, an excellent one at that. And he never gave in to greed or corruption. He was a simple man who lived every moment for his country. All his work at ISRO and his work as the President were to benefit his country. Anger or frustration may have tired him at times but they never swayed him from his righteous path. The many stories of his loving nature and his unfaltering perseverance make him my idol.

Childhood Obesity Awareness Programme



A walkathon for a noble cause

The 'Childhood Obesity Awareness Programme' was organized on 4th September, 2015 in the school premises. As part of this programme, a 'Walk World Walkathon' was conducted in the vicinity of the school. This was done to create awareness about obesity. The school observed the day as 'Yellow Day.' Childhood obesity is a serious medical condition that affects children and adolescents. Many students have been observed to be above the normal weight for their age and height. They have been found to have health problems that were once confined to adults, such as diabetes and high blood pressure.

The Chief Guest for the occasion, was Dr. Uma Koduri from the USA. She is the Founder of Walk World Walkathon Organization; Diplomate American Board of Internal Medicine; Chair, GAPIO Nutrition and Obesity Initiative; Former Chair AAPI (American Association of Physicians of Indian Origin) Childhood Obesity Committee and Founder and Former President, AAPI Tulsa Chapter. She conducted the awareness programme in 70 schools in the USA and in India, this programme in JHPS is a pilot project.



Chairman's Address

Speaking on the occasion Dr. Uma Koduri, spoke about the 5-2-1-0 Magic where the number 5 stands for eating 5 servings of fruits and vegetables every day, 2 stands for two hours or less of recreational screen time, 1 stands for one hour or more of physical activity, and 0 stands for 0 sugary drinks and using more water and low fat milk.

Dr. Rakesh Sahay, Endocrinologist advised the children to eat well, sleep well and be happy. He said that obese children suffer from heart diseases and should make efforts to stay away from them. He requested the students to educate their family and friends about obesity.

Dr. Naunihal Singh, a Pediatrician said that food is the fuel for the body. He also warned that India was on its way to become the global capital of diseases. We must make our population healthy and this initiative has to be taken right from childhood.

TETÊ – A – TETÊ WITH DR. UMA KODURI

The students who were inspired by her approaches were keen on having a talk with her.

How did you feel about being in India ?

India is my motherland. I left India in 1989 and moved to the US. I've been waiting to come back since then. I come often and I love visiting the country.

How did this thought of spreading awareness on obesity among students strike you ?

Everything began when I had a lot of free time. To keep myself busy, I started doing community service. A few doctors and I started educating people to take care of themselves and taught children how to be healthy. After a while, many people started sending us letters encouraging us to do more. A while later we got a grant of \$100,000 from AAPI to cover as many schools as possible with the program which educated children about their health.

What do you think is the role of parents in reducing obesity among children in India ?

Firstly, for the parents to play a role, they need to be educated about the issue, the do's and don't's, the right's and wrong's. After they are educated about the issue, they can start giving their children healthy and nutritious food and motivate them to play outdoors.

How do you think we can motivate a child suffering from obesity to become healthier ?

The children facing obesity do not feel motivated because they aren't aware of the harm it causes today. As soon as they are told how obesity can damage almost every organ in the body, they will automatically feel motivated to exercise and lead a healthy life.

How can the schools contribute in helping to reduce obesity in children ?

The schools can contribute a lot. They can start by inviting doctors who can help spread awareness. We

accomplished a lot in two hours. If we continue to have programs like these, we will manage to educate a lot of people. In today's program, we managed to educate about 1000 people. Schools can also take an initiative to make sure that students eat healthy food while in school.

What is your opinion on surgery for weight loss ?

Personally, I do not recommend surgery because if the patient doesn't follow the proper procedure after surgery he/she will become obese again. It modifies the life style of a person and has quite a few complications.

You've already accomplished so much, can you tell us your plans for the future ?

In the future, we're aiming to spread awareness in as many countries as possible. Our team has a lot of members from different countries and we are trying to motivate them to spread awareness in their area.



keeping oneself fit and healthy. The students had a general health check up conducted by a team of doctors headed by Dr. N.S.D Prasad Rao.





They visited the classes to observe the teaching methods followed and also co-taught in home classes. Teacher and students workshops were also conducted to bring about global awareness of teaching and learning.

Tête-à-Tête with the Foreign Visitors

Sri Sindhu Gunturi and Neha Avula students of Class X interviewed Ms. Renee Lafurgey and Ms. Robyn Pisor Doyle.

Would you please tell us about yourself?

Renee: I'm from Michigan, in The United States, and I'm involved in vocational education.

Robin: I am from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania which is on the Eastern Coast of the United States. In our school we teach children from kindergarten to eighth grade. It is technology based education just like in yours.

What kind of programmes or activities in your school make it different from ours?

Robin: We do a lot of cross-disciplinary activities, actually. For instance, you can see English being taught in a Math class. Speaking for myself, as an Art teacher, I teach a lot of Math, Reading and writing as well. I'd love to see such things being done in your school too.

Renee: At Korea Institute of Science and Technology (KIST) we do a lot of experiential learning. Students get hands-on-experience of everything they learn. Once the curriculum is done, they walk right into the lab and get a practical view of everything, so they learn as they do.



How do you think we can grapple with the problem of unemployment across the world?

Renee: Skill and mind for the job is very essential as you pursue your career. You start your future with an option and branch into other opportunities over a period time. I overheard your Principal addressing you about this. We really appreciate the efforts you all are making in this regard.

How would you describe your experience of the school assembly?

Robin: It was an amazing and fantastic experience! We love the independent reflection and preparations you make for the presentation. Assemblies back in the US are very different from those here. There, it is a special scenario, and happens only during special occasions.

How do you reach out to each student of your classroom? How do you build the rapport with the students and provide incentives to bring out their talents?

Robin: What I do, stay back after school hours and spend a lot of time listening to students, their concerns, ideas and problems. We try to visualize what they're dealing with, to understand them. It doesn't happen in a day or on the first week of school; it takes some time before we slowly build a rapport.

Renee: We, as teachers try to make the

students believe that we are there for them, no matter what. We believe they must know that the students should feel it from the teacher's heart and it takes a few years for us to grow into each other's souls, and to develop those unique bonds so that when we run into them at the grocery store maybe and find them independent and well off, it is really rewarding.

What is your opinion about the role of technology in education and it's over dependence by the youth in the modern world?

Renee: Yes, technology is indeed vital for the development of a student. We have seen the way your school utilizes several technological elements and the facilities are fantastic. Such things are important, but at the same time we have to balance this with other parts of the curriculum. We have to remember that interpersonal skills are essential and we always need to have time for relations. It is good to have that advanced exposure of using technology but the one-on-one conversation you have with your family and friends without the gadgets is really important.

Robin: I would suggest to include more of student collaboration and art integration, as I have mentioned before. I would like to see more small group and large group projects which gives the students a chance to work together.

American Interns at **JHPS**

A team of four American interns Ms. Hillerin, Ms. Arion Adams, Ashley Sheets, Ms. Lori along with Ms. Kiran Padmaraju from Illionois University the USA visited our school in the month of August as a part of their teacher training program. An internship provides experiential learning that integrates knowledge and development of practical application skills.

These trainees shadowed the teachers and observed their teaching methodology for two days. i.e. 3rd and 4th August, 2015. Ms. Lori as a trainee observed the regular teaching, techniques, formative activities, black board presentation and the use of technology in the teaching – learning process. The team of teacher trainees appreciated the usage of technology and activity oriented teaching.

HONING THE SKILLS OF TEACHERS

Department of Science

An in-service training for the Science Department was conducted by Prof.C. Raja Mouli from B.R.Ambedkar Open University. He enlightened the teachers about the various ways and means of teaching science effectively. A brainstorming session on making interesting activities for students also took place. Teachers were given a sheet of paper with infinite circles on it and were asked to make as many diagrams as possible using the circles. This demonstrated the fact that imagination is the core element in effective teaching and learning process.

He advised that Science should kindle curiosity. A Brainstorming technique was introduced to the teachers which would further help the students to gain confidence in analyzing and answering the questions about a certain topic. The session was informative and enriching for the teachers.



Department of Hindi

A workshop for the Hindi Department was held on 22nd April, 2015 on the topic 'Quality Education'. The resource person was Dr. Rajeev Kumar Singh, the State Resource Person of Telangana who emphasized on Right to Education.

The important points which were highlighted during the workshop are Quality Education, RTE Act 2009 & its importance, Development of the four language skills, Stress free Education, Importance of interactive classroom sessions by teachers and Language teaching as a medium of inculcating values and preserving our art and culture.

An awareness about NCF 2005 was also given to the teachers. Dr. Rajeev Kumar Singh was of the view that children should develop a feeling of freedom and should make an effort to interact with the teachers in order to become good listeners and speakers.

The workshop concluded with a unanimous decision stating that stress free and quality education will be imparted to the students.



Department of English

A training was carried out for the English Department on 24th April, 2015. A senior Professor of G. Narayanamma Women's Engineering College, Ms. V. Jahnvi Reddy was the resource person for the session. It was a comprehensive lecture on 'Portfolio Writing'.

Ms. Jahnvi Reddy introduced the teachers to the benefits of Portfolio Writing which will help the students to consolidate their reading and learning that has happened over a period of time. This will not only improve their writing skills but also help in developing their creativity. She also suggested the mind map technique which would make learning interesting. Mind maps help in transferring pictorial information into verbal information which prove to be useful in inculcating writing skills.

To improve speaking skills, she introduced the concept of SPELT, i.e. Social, Political, Environmental Education, Legal and Technology. The students can be encouraged to use these factors as guidelines while discussing and speaking. A new form of presentation, "Pecha Kucha" which is a time based PPT presentation was also discussed.

It was an eye opening session for the teachers where information on the current trends was dealt in a concise manner. This could in turn be incorporated in the regular classes.

Department of Mathematics

A workshop for the Math department was held on 6th June, 2015. The resource person for the session was Dr.Rama Koti Reddy, Principal of Millennium College of Education, Sangareddy. He emphasized that the speed and accuracy of the students need to be enhanced by giving them more practice. He suggested different reference books for teachers which would help them guide the students. He focused on encouraging the students to solve competitive exam paper and also motivate them to develop their interest towards the subject. The teachers were requested to work with passion, discuss challenging problems, read more books on Math and were also given guidelines for setting up question papers. The teachers found the session useful.



Department of Library

An In-service training for the Department of Library was conducted on 8th June, 2015. The resource person, Sri. T. Ashok Babu, Head, Library (Retd.) Advanced System Laboratory, DRDO conducted the session on 'Present scenario of libraries'. The points discussed in the session were; paradigm shift in the role of a librarian from that of a book custodian to a service oriented information provider, emergence of electronic libraries, access to the world of information, Online Public Access Catalogue, emergence of E-print and publishing, advantages of e-books with hyperlinks to different topics, checking the authenticity of the information used by the students and channelizing their queries, free accession to electronic journals along with print copy subscription provided by publishers and efficiency of data storage systems, use of Barcode technology, RFID (Radio Frequency Identification Technology) for security of the books and effective and easy stock checking.

Department of Dance

The Dance Department took part in a workshop on 8th June, 2015 conducted by Mr. T.Karthik, a professional choreographer. He excels in dance forms like Contemporary, Western dance, Folk and Salsa.

He gave an elaborate explanation on the techniques of various dance styles such as Colombian, Brazilian and Indian folk dances. He said that through western dance one can develop one's self confidence, improve body fitness and also express oneself.

He demonstrated and expounded on various styles of western dance and gave some innovative suggestions. The workshop was interactive and intriguing.



Department of Music

A work shop for the Music Department was held on 9th June, 2015 with a view to create interest in music among kindergarten students and the teaching of patriotic songs in different styles" by the Resource person, Ms. Roja Ramani a Masters in Music (Carnatic Vocal).

The resource person enhanced the knowledge of the teachers by sharing different styles of music. She stressed upon the fact that music is an innate ability. She added that Indian classical music is an ocean which is closely related to the devotion of God and is the shortcut path to reach God and attain emancipation.

While teaching music one should come down to the level of the students for better comprehension and gradually develop their interest for a particular art. The tips and the suggestions given by the resource person benefitted the teachers.



Department of Telugu

An inservice training for the Telugu Department was conducted by SCERT Resource person, Sri. L. M. Prasad. The session focused on teaching language through various methods like demonstration of teaching methods with examples, time management in teaching different topics, allocation of 12 periods to complete one particular topic, suggestions to improve creativity in teaching the language and improvement of language knowledge.

He emphasized that teaching Telugu does not mean teaching to read and write but also to develop communication and creative skills amongst the children. The training session concluded with a question answer session in which the teachers interacted with the resource person for further inputs. The training was enlightening and thought provoking for the teachers.



Department of Computer Science

A training session was conducted by KIPS Publication (the new publisher for computer curriculum for Classes I to Classes VIII). The session was conducted by Mrs. Juhi Nanda, Director, KIPS Publication.

It was recommended that the classroom teaching should be made interactive with the inclusion of online quiz. The concept of quiz card can be introduced as a learning tool to make learning fun and pleasurable. The students can be evaluated after the completion of every chapter to monitor their performance. A complete demonstration of the Interactive Learning Module was done for the teachers. Overall, the session was informative and armed the teachers with a lot of useful resources to facilitate classroom learning.



Workshop on Communicating with parents

A workshop on 'Communicating with Parents.' was conducted on 17th April, 2015 by Ms. T. Aarti, the Student Counsellor.

She started the session with an introduction on Effective Partnership between teachers and parents. She said that cultivating a healthy Teacher-Parent relationship is vital for the development of schools as learning communities. Just as teachers are skilled in the art of teaching, they also require knowledge and skills to communicate effectively with the parent community.

She explained the components of Effective Communication which are Positive, Personalized and Proactive Partnership. She advised the teachers to begin the year by communicating with parents positively about the students, if necessary they should make personalized

Further, she spoke about the 'Do's and Don'ts of Communication.' She counselled the teachers to show respect through body language, identify other people and agencies that may be beneficial to help the child and identify personnel who can translate for teacher with language barrier.

Adding on, she spoke about the barriers like lack of time, transportation, child care, unable to understand the system, language/cultural differences, feelings of inferiority which prevent a parent from meeting the teachers.

She concluded the session by saying that Effective Parent-Teacher Conferences is an opportunity to create a successful partnership.

Workshop on Classroom Management

A workshop on 'Behaviour Management for 'Young Learners' was conducted by Ms. Aarti, Clinical Psychologist on 3rd June, 2015.

She stated that the biggest task of a school is discipline and training its students to be obedient. She mentioned that we as teachers should transform the learners into thinkers, doers and leaders. She discussed the various behavioural concerns faced in the class room. She then explained the following points:

- The three key aspects of appreciation, recognition and attention are always liked by the students. Many behavioural problems arise because of less attention that we pay towards simple things unknowingly. Our actions have a lot of influence on students.



Active participation by the Teachers

- She explained that to deal with the behavioural problems, the teacher should find out the cause of the behaviour.
- She demonstrated an activity for better understanding of the behaviour and thinking of students at different age levels.
- She asserted that creativity is an important component in the class room which helps in motivating the students.
- She said that the attention span of an individual is 15-20 minutes. So, we should break down the tasks age appropriately. A reading corner can be introduced for hyper active students where puzzles, books and games can



be kept to engage them. She explained about "Pacing" strategy for classroom management.

- She also discussed about various mental toxins that influence the adolescents. Few mental toxins that influence our personality are gender bias, media, video games and advertisement.
- She explained the difference between error, mistake and crime and ways of correcting it in children.

The workshop concluded with an interactive session by solving the queries of the participants.

Workshop on Positive Thinking

A session on Positive Thinking was conducted on 4th June, 2015 by Ms. C.Madhumathi, Director, Centre for In-Service Teacher Education, Osmania University. She quoted that 'A Sound mind is a sound body'. She suggested the audience to live in the present, accept what is given and not be judgemental. They should also learn to accept and to forgive and forget. Every individual should experience the joy of giving and sharing and be a positive thinker. Being a positive thinker not only helps a person to overcome daily stress but also to become confident and live a longer and healthier life.

She concluded her session by giving tips on usage of positive words while talking, use words that evoke strength and success, practice positive affirmations, redirect negative thoughts and walk towards positive thinking.



Workshop on the 5C's Teaching Learning Model

An in-service training for Science Department was held on 9th June, 2015 by Dr. C. Aruna Rekha, Principal Investigator at Bharadwaj Education and Research Foundation. She basically focused on strengthening the learning skills and abilities while reducing the impact of individual differences among students based on their learning patterns. She emphasized on the teaching learning

process and designing the teaching methodologies that would minimize the gaps between different learning levels of students and bring them into common group under one roof.

The 5C's are- Concept, Creativity, Coherence, Comprehensive Knowledge, and Cross Subject Knowledge.

She advised that teachers should nurture and correlate the concepts with the other subjects and apply the same in their day to day life situations.

The workshop gave a fruitful insight into effective teaching with the 5C's Model and also helped teachers to know the importance of interactive teaching and learning process.

A workshop on Environmental concerns and Eco Club was conducted on 4th June, 2015 by Ms Kirti D'souza. She emphasized that students should have a friendly attitude towards environment and they should love to experience nature. She was also of the view that Environmental Education begins at an early age and children should be taken on Nature walks to bring about awareness in them.

The main motto of an Eco club is to bring about awareness, motivation, commitment, knowledge and acquisition of social values, problem solving skills, evaluation ability and commitment towards environmental concerns.


The Eco Club coordinates the voluntary effort of a group of enthusiastic, environmentally concerned and socially committed students working for the understanding and protection of the environment.

Workshop on Environmental concerns and Eco Club

The Eco club members can organize a one-day environmental education program for the students. The Campus Action Program includes collection of newspaper clippings on environmental issues, preparation of albums for display, to uphold a wall magazine on themes of

environment with photographs, articles, poems, slogans and scripts, street plays, staging environmental dramas, puppet shows, newsletter etc.

She concluded her session by asking the teachers to create a list of natural resources and organizations in the city, district and state related to Environmental Sciences. The workshop conveyed many factual and informative concepts about the environment. The teachers became aware of how they could motivate students to become environmental friendly.

Workshop on Child Sexual Abuse

associated with the topic. The resource persons, then, with the help of role plays, stories and group discussions sensitized the audience about these misconceptions in order to change their approach.

The session emphasized on the measures, policies and precautions that the school should adopt to avoid child sexual abuse. Grooming, the chief component of child sexual abuse was discussed. Light was thrown on various possible means adopted by the offenders and the professional perpetrators through illustrations and real life situations.

Emphasizing once again on the role of the teachers, the session cautioned them through the medium of videos to be vigilant and notice patterns or any peculiar behavioural attitudes in order to identify child sexual abuse and report the same to the higher authority.

The second day's session started with a story and a few situations being displayed where the teachers had to identify whether it was an act of sexual abuse or not. The session highlighted the different behaviours of a sexually abused child. A short film was also shown on CSA



wherein a few experiences of individuals who were groomed and abused were discussed.

The teachers were informed that if any child reports about being abused, then the teacher should verify and soon begin the process of helping the child.

The afternoon session continued with the discussion on the prevention of Child Sexual Abuse and the explanation about various methodologies of teaching personal safety through role plays, discussions, activities, work books and other information brochures. An activity was demonstrated on active, passive and assertive behaviour. A video was shown on personal safety, the good and the bad touch.

A booklet on personal safety education was distributed to teachers. It guided them to teach personal safety. The session was enriching and the teachers would walk an extra mile to spread the awareness.

A workshop on the awareness and prevention of child sexual abuse was conducted on 5th and 6th June, 2015, by the resource persons Ms. Vidya Reddy and Ms. Nancy Thomas from Tulir. Tulir is a Chennai based NGO working to create awareness against Child Sexual Abuse.

The session began with a thought provoking question on the awareness of child sexual abuse among teachers. The resource persons emphasized that the teachers play a significant role in creating awareness about child sexual abuse and its prevention because of the quality time spent by them with the children at school. Every single child is vulnerable to CSA, so the teachers and the management need to be proactive and accountable towards prevention of child sexual abuse.

A questionnaire was distributed to gauge the awareness of the topic amongst the audience. The session welcomed opinions, conceptions/ misconceptions, perceptions, attitudes

Workshop on Behaviour and Classroom Management

A workshop on 'Behaviour and Classroom Management' was conducted by Ms. G. Durga, Secondary Headmistress on 8th June, 2015. She started the session by showing a video of a regular class after which she spoke about the importance of classroom management through a PowerPoint presentation. She then listed out the key components of a classroom management plan. She emphasized on vital points like the teaching model strategies which the teachers can employ to correct and re-direct behaviour/misbehaviour amongst the children. She also suggested the appropriate usage of tone, voice and body language of the teachers.

She was of the view that students must be engaged in activities which will control the attention seeking behaviours. She suggested some techniques for better classroom control and added that a chart for seating arrangement in the classroom would be of a great help. The session truly enhanced the teachers organizational and management skills in the classroom.



Workshop On Positive Interaction

A workshop on "Positive Interaction" was conducted on 9th June, 2015 for the teachers by Ms. Aruna Rekha, the Principal of Bharadwaj Education and Research Centre.

She said that positive interaction helps to improve cognitive development, classroom transaction and teaching methodology of science. She was also of the view that teachers are only facilitators who show the right path to the students.

She laid emphasis on positive interaction stating how it allows in building and developing a good rapport with each child which leads to meaningful learning.

Some of the simple strategies of positive interaction that can be followed in a classroom are:

- Use the child's name
- Use "Mirror Talk" rather than saying "Good Job" to show that they are appreciated.
- Talk with children one to one about their topics of interest.
- Show care and respect.
- Set limits in a supportive and positive way.
- Acknowledge and accept the child's emotions.
- Help each child to develop learning mode.



- Make healthy connection with the family.
- Use interesting and varied vocabulary.

She finally concluded the workshop with the famous saying that:

"Every Truth Has Four Corners . As A Teacher I give You One Corner. It is for You To Find the Other Three"--- Confucius

Workshop on Bloom's Taxonomy



A workshop was conducted by the Academic Director Ms. G.Sree Devi on 11th June, 2015 emphasizing the importance of Bloom's Taxonomy in the current scenario. She threw light on the history and background of the Bloom's Taxonomy saying that it was created in

1959 under the leadership of educational psychologist, Dr. Benjamin Bloom. Mahatma Gandhi has in fact propagated this much before as the Head, Hand and Heart theory and called it Nai Taleem. This was in contradiction to the British propagated 'Rote Learning' which was strategised to create followers. She also added that Bloom's Taxonomy helps in classifying Learning Objectives.

The three main domains of Bloom's Taxonomy are: Cognitive (Head), Affective (Feeling/Heart) and Psychomotor (Skills). The cognitive domain consists of six other domains like remembering, understanding, application, analysis, synthesis, and evaluation. Affective domain includes emotional reactions, receiving, responding, valuing, organizing and characterizing. Psychomotor domain includes perception, set (readiness to act) guided response, mechanism, complex overt response, adaptations and origination. Cue questions based on Bloom's Taxonomy of Critical Thinking were listed and the teachers were asked to design a task subject wise using Bloom's Taxonomy.

She concluded her session by giving a questionnaire and asking the teachers to categorize the question as per the cognitive domain. The session revised the teachers knowledge about Bloom's Taxonomy and would be fruitful to take it back to class.



Global Teacher Exchange Programme

The measures adopted to identify the dyslexic students were discussed in which a list of indicators was supplied to the teachers. The teachers were advised to record the observations given under each indicator and access the aid of the counsellor as and when required.

The protagonist, Beatrice Prior narrates the story through her point of view and manages to keep the readers on the edge of their seats.

The story takes place in future Chicago, where the society is divided into five factions, each dedicated to the cultivation of a particular virtue – Erudite (the intelligent), Candor (the truthful), Amity (the kind), Dauntless (the brave) and Abnegation (the selfless). On an appointed day of every year called the Choosing Ceremony, all sixteen year old of every faction must select a faction they will be a part of for the rest of their lives. Beatrice's decision is between staying with her family and being who she really is. Her choice surprises everyone, including



herself. Her reasons are the result she received for an aptitude test that tells her she is Divergent which means, she has an aptitude for more than one faction, a trait considered dangerous by the government and believed to bring about the downfall of the world.

Her chosen faction gives her something she has never had throughout her life which is freedom.

She meets people from other factions and befriends a Candor girl called Christina and an Erudite boy called Will. She meets a boy who opens a whole new world to her, a world riddled with danger because he shares her secret. And all the while, she doesn't realize that someone is plotting to overthrow the city and establish a dictatorship and use her to do so.

If we take a close look into the books we can see that the scenes start to get a little too vague and instead of intruding the reader they frustrate the person. Some scenes are a little confusing and at times, the scenes have a tendency to become irrelevant to the original plot.

Despite its short comings, the book is absolutely amazing. It is gripping and well written, enabling the reader to visualize every scene. Veronica's imagination is over the top and her world couldn't have been more realistic. There have been comparisons between Divergent and other fiction trilogies such as Hunger Games and Mazerunner. 
