


Learning facilitated through exhilarating School Assemblies



Success at a tender age

t is indeed very prestigious for JHPS to have Siddharth Nagarajan of 2012 batch; the world's fastest and youngest drummer, from amongst the alumni. He earned a place in the Limca Book of Records as the youngest drummer of India at the age of 3 to 5 years from 2001-2003. He was awarded with an Honorary Doctorate from University of UK. He is also considered as one of seven geniuses in the world by National Geographic Channel. The students of the Hillside News had the opportunity to share a few minutes with him to gain inspiration from his life.

What are the values that you have learnt from school and did they have any impact on your life?

JHPS is a huge milestone in my life and every person I have met or have interacted with from JHPS has created a great impact on me. JHPS taught me to grow as an individual and in believing myself. School gave me a lot of friends and the support from the school to my music and career is unimaginable which I am forever grateful for.

What inspired you to choose this profession?

I hail from a family of musicians. My Grandfather being a Tablist for K.V Mahadevan, a legendary Music Director for more than 45 years and my Father Nagiis also a Drummer/ Percussionist who has been recording and performing with legendary artists including the maestro Ilayaraja and many others like DSP, Mani Sharma, Koti etc. My Mother Vidya is a full fledged Indian classical singer and my sister is also an incredible singer and an Ex Student of JHPS. So, I think it was naturally an instinct for me to lean towards music. I am the 5th generation of musicians from my family and the 3rd generation for Rhythms.

How do you think the school and its values have helped you face challenges in life?

> I was an average student in school and could not even keep up the attendance level but the support and encouragement that I got from the Principal Ms. M. Varalakshmi, and the Chairman, Sri. A. Murali Mukund was incredible, not once did they put me down or taunt me for it. On the other hand, Mr. Murthy, Chemistry Sir and the other teachers helped me by taking extra classes and my classmates were asked to share notes. This gave me the confidence to pursue my interest and I understood the value of friendship and compassion.

One piece of advice to the students that you would like to give?


